A MESSAGE FROM FR. BARRETT

The Lord be with you!

Holy Week begins this year on April 13th with Palm Sunday. This is the one Sunday of the year when we gather in the narthex to start worship. After the Palm Sunday liturgy and the blessing of the palms, we process in to the sanctuary with our palms. This commemorates Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem to start his Passion. The gospels say that he was greeted by a great crowd laying palms on the dusty as they celebrated the arrival of the Messiah into David's city. The mood of celebration turns dark as we hear the reading of Jesus' trial, torture, and death. Because Good Friday is attended by only a handful, this is the only time in the year when most members will hear the full story of Jesus' sacrifice for all sinners.

Maundy Thursday-The name comes from the Latin *mandatum*, meaning commandment. On this night Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment. "Love one another as I have loved you." At the supper he gave the commandment which is repeated every time we share Holy Communion. "Take and eat, this is my body." "Take and drink. This is my blood shed for many." The altar is stripped reminding us of Jesus humiliation. The chalice is tipped over on the altar, symbolizing the pouring out of Jesus' blood for us, and we leave in silence.

Good Friday.-This is also known as the Tenebrae service, meaning service of shadows. We worship at both noon (when Jesus was nailed to the cross) and in the evening as Jesus dead body was taken down from the cross at dusk. Again we leave in silence. There is no communion at this worship and no music. The altar is still bare.

The Saturday Easter Vigil-This is the oldest liturgy in the Church. I know that some members would like me to start this Mass a little earlier as they don't drive at night. Although I am sensitive to your needs, I cannot do this and be faithful to the symbolism of this night. We begin in darkness and end in light. This symbolizes Jesus laid in the tomb Saturday and rose from the dead on Easter. The Easter celebration begins on Saturday at this Mass and continues on Sunday morning. Worship begins with lighting the Paschal or Easter candle from the new fire. We then enter by candlelight and hear five Old Testament readings which remind us of God's history of grace to humanity. Then we renew or baptismal vows at the fount. We return to our seats, the lights come on, and Easter begins!


