A MESSAGE FROM FR. BARRETT

The Lord is risen!

It is September, back to school month. This is also the month when churches tend to awake from summer hibernation. Many congregations kick this off with an event called "Rally Day." The monthly newsletter resumes. If Christian ed. classes such as Sunday school, were suspended for the summer, they resume. Attendance tends to increase as vacations end and snow birds return home. This is all well and good. There is One who does not observe this cycle-God. The apostle Peter exalts us to "always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." (1 Peter 3:15.

This Sunday I invite you to look carefully at your bulletin while waiting for the Mass to begin. On the back you will find a list of our ministries as well as the names of the members who serve on the Vestry. You may have glanced at this over the years or never noticed it. You may consider it as unnecessary information or of passing interest with no relevance to the Mass. This Sunday I ask you to consider it an invitation. The apostle James exhorts all of us to be not just "hearers of the Word, but doers of the Word." I don't think this is simply a call to personal morality. I think it is a call to participate in the life of the congregation. Christianity is lived out in the context of community. We are a family of believers called together by one Lord.

Take a moment to consider your gifts. God makes two promises through Christ. The first is that every Christian is given one, and usually more than one, gift from the Holy Spirit in our baptism. The second is that God will never call us to a ministry without giving us the tools to accomplish that ministry.

Every Sunday I rejoice to see our members taking time to greet each other in the sharing of the peace. It is a wonderful sign of our solidarity in Christ. Another sign is using our gifts for the mutual building up of the body of Christ. The apostle Paul wrote this to the Ephesians: It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Crist may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and n the knowledge of the son of God and become manure, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. (Ep. 4:11-13). I urge you to reverse the message of the prosperity preachers of the gospel. "Ask not what Jesus can do for you, ask what you can do for Jesus and his Church."
